



Peover Hall & Its Gardens, Chapel & Carolean Stables

Afternoon visit by own transport on Thursday 26th June 2025

Including afternoon tea £16 per TGS member + £3 per non member

A visit to Peover Hall gardens is a delight for everyone. Providing a wonderful backdrop to the gardens is Peover Hall, a Grade 2* listed Elizabethan family house dating from 1585 situated within 500 acres of landscaped 18th Century parkland. The formal gardens were designed around 1890 and feature a series of 'garden rooms' with clipped box and yew hedging. There is also a water garden, a Romanesque loggia, beautiful topiary work and pleached lime trees.

The Hall itself has splendid oak panelling and is furnished with contents that have a historical connection to Peover and the Mainwarings, the original owners. It served as the headquarters of General Paton during the Second World War. There will be a guided tour at 2.30 and 3.30.

Beyond the gardens lies the Chapel which was built in the 14th Century and is a mixture of mediaeval and Georgian styles.

The architectural jewel of the visit is the Grade 1 listed Carolean stables built in 1654.

Afternoon tea will be served after the house tours.
